This year's work

The Creative Learning Trust (CLT) was formed to take over all the educational work of The Clinical Science & Education Foundation (CSEF). The CLT has the mandate to continue this work in Romania and to extend it to include the United Kingdom. Special emphasis will be placed on the production of learning resources for both children and adults with special needs.

We expect that the CSEF will be removed shortly from the Charity Commission's register of charities. The CSEF bank account has been closed and new donations to this account are no longer accepted. Existing CSEF funds have been transferred to the CLT to be used strictly as the donors requested.

A number of projects were completed this summer. A classroom was refurbished at **Kozmutza Flóra Hallássérültek Speciális Iskolája** (formally (Hungarian) School for the Deaf No. 2). A large batch of specialised learning resources were made and given to three Romanian and three UK schools/clinics. We started to make laser cut and engraved plastics materials and a set of 16 miniature dioramas were completed for the children at the Transylvanian Autism Association in Cluj-Napoca. More details of these projects are given overleaf.

A special donation

Last year we saw a very interesting mural in the children's section of a Budapest bookshop (Libri in Duna Plaza). Our Hungarian colleague, Eszter Kopányi, who is the manager there told us it was created by a well-known illustrator, Panka Pásztohy. With Eszter's support we contacted the artist who readily agreed that we could use, without any charge, some of her illustrations at the Kindergarten in the Hungarian school that we support in Cluj-Napoca.

Consequently, **Panka's Reading Corner** was born! This was to the great delight of both children and teachers.

We gratefully acknowledge the very kind and generous gesture of Panka Pásztohy in allowing us to use her excellent illustrations in this Kindergarten.

Next year's work

Transylvanian Autism Association.

Continued regular maintenance of therapy rooms and classrooms that we upgraded for the Association is needed. Next year we would like to refurbish at least two of their rooms. In addition, we want to introduce some of the recent resources we have developed for Speech and Language Therapy. This will include appropriate laser-engraved materials. **COST: £2,250**

Kozmutza Flóra Hallássérültek Speciális Iskolája.

(formally (Hungarian) School for the Deaf No. 2) This year we refurbished the 'Blue Classroom' at the school that we had upgraded in 2006. The work included replacing the flooring that was in a very poor state. The form teacher wrote to us saying '... The classroom looks sooooo (sic) nice, it's clean and it's like a totally different room. We managed to take our stuff back in today and worked a few hours so it looks like home ...'

The Laurie Whelan Education Awards.

The CLT actively supports the Romanian National Society of Family Medicine in Cluj-Napoca in its vocational training of young GPs. Our Romanian colleague, Dr. Emiliana Costiug, together with Dr. Anca Balan, are currently organising a training course on 'Palliative Care and Pain Management'. At the time of writing this we have been told that the session will be run by specialised trainers and held at the end of November. Around 20 participants are expected to attend the course.

The CLT want to fund further training during 2018. COST: £750

UK Support

Three UK groups are now using resources developed by the CLT for Speech and Language Therapy. These groups are providing us with valuable feedback crucial for the improvement and development of our materials. Two groups are working with early years children, while the third is involved with adults having communication difficulties following strokes.

We believe that these collaborations should continue and be extended to include other UK groups. **COST: £1,500**.

New Resources

The design and manufacture of effective and interesting learning resources is an essential part of the work of the CLT. We believe that this year we have made a sound start to this work, but more can be achieved. Supported by UK and Romanian colleagues we intend to produce more diverse and useful materials next year for both children and adults with special needs.

Our goal is to have the means of readily making any themed resource of any size (domino. A7, A6, A5, A4. mural) and shape (square, rectangle, circle, etc.) in a wide variety of materials (paper, wood, plastics). To these ends we plan to develop further the use of laser cutting and engraving in the production of learning resources. This is a powerful method of producing reasonably priced, durable and tactile products. Direct UV colour printing on to acrylics also will be investigated. **COST: £1,500**
