Introduction

Over the past couple of years the CLT has produced over 150 different resources for speech and language therapists (SLT) who support children and adults. The resources range from themed laminated printed cards (A4, A5, A6 and A7), to ID-size PVC cards and laser cut/engraved acrylic materials. As we are developing new resources all the time we have decided to produce annual updates so that users and supporters are kept informed of our progress.

In this first issue of *Update* we will be discussing some of the CLT resources that are becoming firm favourites with our users and the newer materials that are currently being assessed.

Laser-produced materials

A wide range of laser cut/engraved tiles, jigsaws and dominoes are available for paediatric SLT work. Most are made from white/blue acrylic laminates, but we now produce them in special two-colour plywood. The latter are sprayed with a clear lacquer to enable effective cleaning with antibacterial wipes. Popular nine-piece jigsaws have the themes of transport, fruit, vegetables and clothes. Tiles and dominoes are similarly themed.

The use of ID-size plastic cards

Small ID cards were first used by the CLT when a resource called *Semantic Categorization* was made for SLT work with adults. The standard ID plastic cards (86 mm x 54 mm) have themed images and are used with a special template. These focus on the patient's ability to organise groups of related objects into different category levels (superordinate, basic and subordinate categories). The cards, printed in-house on an ID card printer, have high-resolution coloured images.

Since then we have significantly increased the range and scope of the printed cards and they are included in basic sets of SLT resources for both children and adults (see adjacent column).

Basic sets of SLT resources

The CLT has two sets of resources, one for SLT work with children and the other for adults, based on the feedback from specialist therapists. These basic sets are given to organisations in Romania and the UK that request our materials and to selected therapists, especially those at the start of their career. To-date five sets for children and seven sets for adults have been issued. These sets will be augmented as new and improved products are produced.

Miniature dioramas

A few years ago we produced 16 different miniature dioramas for children with autism at the Transylvanian Autism Association in Cluj-Napoca, Romania. Subsequently, three dioramas were given to the Hungarian School, Kozmutza Flóra Hallássérültek Speciális Iskolája in the same city for use in a class of children with learning difficulties. As these proved very successful a demountable version was developed enabling the teacher or therapist to create in only 2-3 minutes any themed diorama.

We are currently making three dioramas (living room, garden and a clothes shop) to be assessed for their usefulness during SLT work with young children.
